RED

RED

We want to welcome all you folks who are kind enough to tune in to our first ever show, right Lefty?

LEFTY

Spot on, Red. We though we'd take a dive into new digital media and produce out own radio podcast. We had all the necessary elements; microphones, internet service and way too much spare time.

RED

Well heck, if Gwyneth Paltrow can have one, why not us?

LEFTY

We're just as interesting and little less New Age crazy.

RED

So here we are.

LEFTY

Here we are.

RED

The maiden voyage of Land-yacht Radio.

JINGLE: Landyacht Radio!

LEFTY

And I have to say our show is pretty unique.

(MORE)

LEFTY (CONT'D)

We broadcast live from a vintage 1966 Airstream landyacht travel trailer located on our beautiful twenty-five acre property tucked in the rolling hills between Richland Center and the Highland Township.

RED

And it's also our home.

LEFTY

That's right.

RED

Now we didn't originally intend to host a radio show.

LEFTY

We did not.

RED

We bought this property over twenty years ago to become farmers.

LEFTY

Yes we did.

RED

We had the perfect crop; a rare, unusual, yet very popular product that was going to become the hottest item at the Farmer's Markets. Unfortunately, we discovered one fatal drawback--

LEFTY

Mangos do not grow well in Wisconsin.

RED

They do not.

LEFTY

So, after eight unsuccessful growing seasons, we had to face the music and pay the bills. So I picked up a job at Veletnik's Welding in Lone Rock. Funny story, I actually lied about the years of experience I had as a welder--

RED

--You had none.

LEFTY

I had none. First day on the job, I picked up the wrong end of the welding torch.

RED

Lopped off all of his fingers.

LEFTY

Every last one. But, I replaced them with a handy, stainless steel multi-use claw.

RED

He goes as Captain Hook every Halloween.

LEFTY

And ironically, my given Christian name is Lefty. Lefty Horatio Sobczek. So, this whole disfiguring welding accident hook thing is just a happy coincidence.

RED

Well, when the good lord welds shut a door, he breaks open a window.

LEFTY

Amen.

JINGLE: Landyacht Weather!

LEFTY (CONT'D)

Oops, that jingle tell us it's time for local weather. Let me stick my head out here.

We hear the sound of a window opening and his head outside.

LEFTY (CONT'D)

Well, it looks like it's gonna be partly cloudy, although it's hard to see past the black walnut leaves that are overhanging the trailer. So--yeah--no, I'm gonna say partly cloudy with a chance of rain later...or not.

JINGLE: Landyacht Weather!

RED

Since this is our first ever show,  
we thought we'd give you folks a  
tour of our studios. See what we're  
all about. What makes Landyacht  
Radio tick.

LEFTY

A little tough to do in a non-  
visual medium, but what the heck.

The sound of Lefty and Red moving about the trailer. A door  
opens.

RED

So to start with, this is the  
bathroom.

LEFTY

Gender friendly.

RED

It has an actual flush toilet and a  
baby changing station.

LEFTY

I just nailed the lid of an old  
cooler onto the wall with a piano  
hinge, but, hey, dirty diapers  
can't be choosers.

The door shuts. More movement.

RED

And over here, behind this tiny  
closet is the hi-tech equipment  
room. The heart beat of Land-yacht  
Radio.

SFX Door Opening.

LEFTY

And inside here is the guy who  
makes it all happen; chief engineer  
Wayland Smaltz.

RED

Hi-ya Wayland.

WAYLAND

Oh, Hi-Dee-Hoo.

RED

We're so very lucky to have a man of Wayland's experience on staff.

WAYLAND

Aw, shucks...

RED

He spent three years at the Radio Shack in Dodgeville before they closed up.

LEFTY

What-cha doing there Wayland?

RED

Looks like a complicated job. Are we still on air?

WAYLAND

Oh sure..y'ow, I'm just re-routing the ICOM IC-7300 to bypass the Network Switcher and run it directly to the, y'ow, HR70 BAP Processor...y'ow.

RED

That...doesn't look like standard wiring.

WAYLAND

Yeah, well, y'ow, I ran out of the D-55 digital wiring harnesses so...y'ow, I just snipped a hunk of barbed wire from the fence out back, and uh...y'ow. I mean it's metal and, it bends and stuff, so...y'ow.

RED

Okay

LEFTY

You're the expert.

RED

(jokingly.)

Your not gonna burn the place down are you?

WAYLAND

(chuckling.)

Oh, no...

SFX door shutting.

WAYLAND (CONT'D)  
 ...I mean...probably not.

SFX door shuts. Lefty and Red moving.

LEFTY  
 Now let's go back to where the  
 money's made. In the rear of the  
 trailer is the office of Sales and  
 Promotions.

RED  
 And heading up that department is  
 our sales and promotions whiz,  
 Ethyl Flapsaddle.

LEFTY  
 So Ethyl, what's new on the S&P  
 front?

Ethyl's voice is quiet and barely audible as she stammers and  
 halts in her speech.

ETHYL  
 Hi...I...uh,dmnmnmbn...uh...have  
 nmndt-† uhmm...

LEFTY  
 Sorry, you're going to have to  
 speak up there, Ethyl. Step right  
 up and eat the microphone, as they  
 say.†

Ethyl is extremely close to the microphone, distorting  
 everything.

ETHYL  
 MMMPH..GLORP...MAWANNPH!

LEFTY  
 Okay, not literally, sweetheart.  
 Let's just split the difference,  
 okay?

ETHYL  
 (shy and meek.)  
 How's this?

LEFTY  
 Perfect.

SFX: Cats meowing.

RED

I see you brought your cats in today. Ethyl.

LEFTY

You said you had four at home, but right now I'm counting...at least nine.

ETHYL

Yes, well, the Cat Fancier's Shelter in Boscobel was running a two for one sale on foster kitties last week. So now I've got Mr. Snotzi, Ahab Fuzzy Belly, Lou Jacobi, Her Ladyship Gland Squeezer-

LEFTY

--You're quite the feline enthusiast.

ETHYL

Oh yes...some days I wish I was a cat instead of a human person.

LEFTY

Uh-huh...

ETHYL

They're mysterious and independent and graceful...and who wouldn't want to poop in a box of sand once in a while?

LEFTY

Okay, moving on. What progress have you made in the old S&P department?

ETHYL

Well, I have my sales notebook, which I've gridded off into equal columns of two inches by one inch, with potential sponsors on the left side in blue, and accrued ad dollars and donations on the top in red.

SFX: Cat meowing and snarling.

ETHYL (CONT'D)

No, Mr. Snotzie! Down!

LEFTY

And have you made any sales calls  
so far?

ETHYL

(petrified.)

Calls?...Oh, no...no, no, no, no,  
no, no, no...I can't--

(hyperventilating.)

I can't...oh god...no, no...I  
can't...talk...talk to...

(weeping.)

Go outside? And talk? To people? To--  
-oh god. I'm sorry...I have to...I  
just...

She leaves, weeping. Sounds of cats fighting.

LEFTY

Okay Ethyl, well you just take five  
and we'll get back to you.

From off mike.

ETHYL

Oh god!

LEFTY

You'll have to excuse Ethyl.

RED

She has a bit of a shyness issue.

LEFTY

Actually she suffers from something  
called Anthropophobia.

RED

Which is a dreaded fear of all  
living humans.

LEFTY

A little hitch in her giddy-up, but  
I'm sure once she gets her feet wet  
on a few sales calls, she'll be  
just fine.

We hear Ethyl crying in the background.

RED

Let's take a break for the few  
advertisers we do have. You're  
listening to Landyacht Radio.

RED  
 (chuckling.)  
 Hey Lefty, it's that time again.

LEFTY  
 You bet. Time for Lefty and Red's  
 Ask Your Neighbor.

RED  
 The call-in show where you give  
 advice, post a problem, make an  
 announcement or just swap and  
 barter goods and services with  
 folks in the area.

LEFTY  
 No money changes hands, no hard  
 feelings.

RED  
 It's our little, local radio  
 version of FaceBook.

LEFTY  
 Without all the pictures of  
 desserts, cats doing gymnastics or  
 deep state propaganda.

RED  
 And no ads.

LEFTY  
 So if you got something you'd like  
 to talk about, get off your chest  
 or want to barter with your  
 neighbor, pick up the phone and  
 give us a call.

SFX: Phone ring.

LEFTY (CONT'D)  
 And there's our first caller. Hi,  
 you're on Lefty and Red's Ask Your  
 Neighbor.

LOUELLA  
 Hello, this is Louella Bowie  
 calling from over in Boaz.

LEFTY  
 Hi-ya Louella, what can we do for  
 you?

LOUELLA

Well, I just wanted to let folks know that the Swing Dance evening at the VFW last Friday was such a big hit, that we're scheduling a few more.

LEFTY

Terrific!

LOUELLA

Ya', so next Friday we're have Rhumba Lessons 101, then the following Thursday will be an evening of Waltz, Fox Trot and Twerking. No charge either night, just bring a dish to pass.

LEFTY

Sounds like a lot of fun to get out and shake your tail feathers in Boaz the next couple of weeks.

LOUELLA

Oh, and music supplied by Jerry Merton and his Magic Organ. Thanks, bye-bye.

LEFTY

Gotta love Jerry's organ.

Phone Ring SFX

RED

And we have another call. Hi, welcome to Lefty and Red's Ask Your Neighbor.

BERT

Hi, this is Bert Coombs over in Lime Ridge.

RED

What's up, Bert?

BERT

I work at the muffler shop on main street over here, and I just wanted to let folks know there is a suspicious looking guy walking back and forth on the sidewalk the last few hours singing songs...real loud.

RED  
Singing songs?

BERT  
Real loud, yeah. I called the  
police, but they said they couldn't  
do much at the moment, so...

RED  
What's he singing, Bert?

BERT  
Oh, you know, lot's of 80's hits,  
mostly. Right now he's belting out  
"Some Like It Hot" by Robert Palmer  
and The Power Station.

RED  
Well that's a crime right there.

LEFTY  
Gonna be stuck in my head for the  
next few hours.

RED  
Well keep us posted with any late  
breaking singing news, okay Bert?

BERT  
Ya, you got it, thanks.

Ringin Phone SFX.

RED  
Hi, welcome to Ask Your Neighbor.

WOMAN  
Hello, we just moved my Mom into  
the White Oaks Retirement Facility,  
and cleaning out her house last  
weekend, we found a bunch of  
crocheted toilet paper cozies.

RED  
Uh-huh...

WOMAN  
You know, the fancy ones with the  
little ballerina doll on top.

RED  
Right?

WOMAN

All glittery and what not.  
Well...going through the closets  
and drawers, we found she made a  
lot of them. Many. Many, many.

RED

How much is many, would you say?

WOMAN

Somewheres between two and four  
thousand.

RED (V.O.)

Oh my...

WOMAN

Plus, about 500 skeins of assorted  
colored yarns and dozens of crochet  
hooks, all sizes. So...if anybody  
wants a cozie for the back of their  
toilet, or yarns or hooks, please  
stop by and we'd be happy to  
unload. Please, really, we need  
help.

RED

And where can folks go if they want  
these cozies--

Sound of a phone hanging up.

RED (CONT'D)

Oh geeze, they hung up.

LEFTY

That's not gonna help the cause.

RED

No sir.

LEFTY

I'm gonna predict a lot of  
unclaimed TP Ballerinas.

Phone Ring SFX.

LEFTY (CONT'D)

And another caller. Hi, your on Ask  
Your Neighbor with Lefty and Red.

BERNICE

(on the phone.)

Hello, this is Bernice Ramsey, over  
in Muscoda.

LEFTY

Hiya, Bernice. Good to hear from  
you again. What can we swap for  
you?

BERNICE

Well, I have a very nice, queen  
sized mattress I'd like to trade.  
It's about eight years old, but in  
very nice shape. Very firm and  
springy and everything.

LEFTY

Uh-huh...

BERNICE

Now it's a little stained. But it's  
just coffee. Coffee stained.  
Believe me. Nothing else. Just  
coffee.

LEFTY

Okay, so Bernice has a nice,  
springy, slightly coffee stained  
queen sized mattress, and what  
would you like to trade for it?

BERNICE

Well, I'm looking for two tickets  
to see the Osmond Brothers  
Christmas Spectacular Show in  
Branford, Missouri this December.

LEFTY

Oh, The Osmonds? They put on one  
heck of a show.

BERNICE

Well, my sister's coming to stay  
with me over the Holidays, and she  
just loves that Donnie & Marie.

LEFTY

SFX: Phone Ring.

RED

And we've got another caller. Hi, you're on Lefty and Red's Swap Meet.

HERM

Hi, this is Herm Demmel from over at the Clyde School...

RED

Hiya, Herm. What can we do for you?

HERM

Well I tell ya', that queen sized mattress sounds just like what the doctor ordered for me, what with my ciatica and what not. I mean, the mattress I have now is fine. It's perfectly good. My grandfather died on it about twenty-five years ago. But it is getting a little lumpy and I'm due for a change.

RED

You don't mind that it's a little stained, do you?

HERM

Oh no, I prefer stains, actually.

RED

Okay, well we won't go any further with that. You happen to have those tickets to the Osmonds Show Bernice wanted?

HERM

Not exactly, but I think I might have something just as good.



RED

Well we've still got her on hold,  
let's bring her back and see what  
she thinks.

LEFTY

RED
