

LANDYACHT RADIO WITH LEFTY AND RED-EPISODE EIGHT

SFX: papers shuffling. Chairs moving.

RED

Okay, we need to finalize the stories we're covering for this weeks' show. Lefty, what have we decided on so far?

LEFTY

Uh, we've got the German cooking segment in-studio with Helga Farzcrapper. She's making something called Sulze?

RED

Sulze...what's that?

LEFTY

I imagine it's some kind of powdered donut.

RED

Oh, nice.

LEFTY

Krazy Kraft Korner with Mitchell from Mitchell's Krazy Krafts in Hollendale.

RED

Okay.

LEFTY

And Bob Knefpler's covering the regional boys tennis quarter-finals from The Cobb Community Center.

RED

So, we still need to fill about ten minutes. Herm, can you get us a live traffic update out by the bridge on Otter Creek? The one near Lone Rock? I hear they're doing some work on it.

HERM

Sure, Red. That'll be backing up about three tractors, at least.

RED

Good.

HERM

And if you need me to, I got my box of records in the back of the truck. I can do some fill-in music for you, too.

RED

If we get in a pinch, sure.

ETHYL

I have a suggestion.

LEFTY

No cat stories, Ethyl.

ETHYL

Oh, okay. And what about--

LEFTY

No stationary stories either.

ETHYL

But--

LEFTY

No pens. No pencils. No staplers. Okay?

ETHYL

Fine.

LEFTY

Anything else?

COOKIE

Lefty, Red, what about that story I taped last week about the alien abduction?

LEFTY

I don't know...

RED

Wait, I didn't hear about this. Go on, Cookie.

COOKIE

I interviewed a man who claims, in the middle of the night, he saw flashing colored lights in the sky. He heard eerie, blaring music.

(MORE)

COOKIE (CONT'D)

When he went out to investigate, he says he was abducted by strange figures who strapped him to a gurney and "intimately" probed him for his DNA.

RED

Wow, this sounds like a lead story.

LEFTY

(skeptical.)

Well...

COOKIE

He says the alien beings then set him free and disappeared into the night, never to be seen again.

RED

Lefty, how come I didn't hear about this?

LEFTY

Red...it was Bert.

RED

(disappointed.)

Oh, was it? Bert Coomes from Lime Ridge?

COOKIE

Yes, exactly.

LEFTY

Cookie, this guy calls in to the show every week with a new conspiracy theory. He's afraid of his own shadow.

RED

He once called and said he saw Black Helicopters flying over his house.

LEFTY

Turns out it was a fly on his kitchen window, and he didn't have his glasses on.

RED

He realized that *after* he called the FBI, the CIA and NASA.

LEFTY

So we take everything Bert says
with a huge grain of salt.

COOKIE

But Lefty--

LEFTY

Hey, I know. Why don't we send
Cookie out to do a live remote with
the Mutant Cow guy?

RED

Oh yeah. Seems there's this guy out
near Pecatonica, he's kind of a
local celebrity. He's had a string
of mutant cows born on his farm;
six legs, two heads, three sets of
udders.

LEFTY

He's even sold a few to The
Ripley's Believe It Or Not Museum.

RED

Okay, let's shelve the alien
abduction story and get you out to
Pecatonica to cover the mutant
cows.

COOKIE

(disappointed.)
All right.

LEFTY

Okay, if there isn't anything else,
let's get to it.

SFX: Chairs moving.

ETHYL

Lefty, what about a hard expose on
the paper clip industry?

LEFTY

Nope.

MUSIC: Land Yacht Radio With Lefty & Red Opening

LEFTY (CONT'D)

Greetings good Driftless area
folks, I'm Lefty.

RED
 And I'm Red. And you've tuned into
 Land Yacht Radio.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red!

LEFTY
 We've got a bunch of interesting
 stuff from area folks coming up.

RED
 We're gonna be doing some German
 cooking.

LEFTY
 Learn some home made crafts for
 those rainy days with the kids.

RED
 And visit a Pecatonica farmer who
 has good luck with mutant cows.

LEFTY
 But first, let's break for this
 commercial message.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red!

Ad for Dairy Aire Dairy.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red

LEFTY (CONT'D)
 Well today in the studio we're
 going to make some delicious treats
 with our own German chef from the
 Dusseldorf Dungeon Helga
 Farzcrapper. Welcome, Helga.

HELGA
 Ja, hello Lefty and hello Red.

RED
 So Helga, I understand this dish
 your preparing is a German favorite
 for the Spring Holidays.

HELGA
 Oh ja. Everyone in Germany loves
 preparing and eating this treat.
 Especially the kids.

LEFTY
 I understand it's called Sulze?

HELGA

Sulze, ja.

RED

And how do we go about preparing
this Sulze?

HELGA

Well, first you start with the main
ingredient.

SFX: Pig's head slopping/squishing on to the counter.

LEFTY

(shocked.)
Oh sweet lord!

RED

(horrified.)
Dear god, is that a...

HELGA

Pig's head, ja.

LEFTY

Oh...I think it's dripping on the--
(calling.)
Wayland! Can you fetch a tarp,
please?

WAYLAND

(calling back.)
On it!

RED

It's staring at me.

HELGA

In the Spring, after we slaughter
all of the hogs, the women and
children take the head and joyously
prepare the Sulze.

LEFTY

And how do we...what do we...?

HELGA

After boiling the head, which I did
on the way over, you pick all the
meat from the face, from the
eyelids and nostrils and ear lobes,
and the jowls, don't forget the
jowls. That meat is nice and juicy.
The kids love picking at the jowls.

RED
That can't be right.

HELGA
Then, after you finished picking
off the face meat, you make a
gelatin.

LEFTY
And how do you...?

HELGA
You pull all the face fat from the
cheeks and render it down to a
beautiful, slimy gel. Then you stir
the meat into the gel and put it
into the icebox. And that's it.
After a few hours, you spread the
Sulze onto hearty rye bread with
raw onion. The children just love
it.

LEFTY
I bet.

HELGA
So...shall we start picking at the
pig face?

RED
Uh...let's take a break from pig
face-picking for this commercial.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red!

SFX: Car interior.

COOKIE
Thanks for driving me out to this
remote, Herm.

HERM
Oh, no problem. I'd rather be out
on the road on such a nice day.
Even though I am missing a fresh
Sulze on rye.

COOKIE
This is it, right here.

SFX: Car stopping. Doors opening/closing. Footsteps on
gravel. Car pulling away.

PAUL
Hello, greetings!

COOKIE
Mr. Paul Coiler?

PAUL
That's me.

COOKIE
Cookie Hightower, WLYR Radio.

PAUL
Yep, they said you was comin'.
Yanno, rustle up some grub for our
guest.

YANNO
Yes, Mr. Paul.

PAUL
And maybe some lite beers.

YANNO
Yes, Mr. Paul.

PAUL
Yanno's Filipino. Can't barely
understand a word he says, but he
makes a great ceviche. Real tasty.

COOKIE
Uh, no thank you.

PAUL
Suit yourself.

COOKIE
Mr. Coiler, we're going live in a
few minutes. I'd just like you to
take us on a basic tour for the
folks at home, and maybe get to
know a few of your unusual calves.

PAUL
The mutants, you mean?

COOKIE
Exactly.

PAUL
Oh sure, no problem. They're out in
the back forty. We can take a ride
out there in my new pickup.

COOKIE

Terrific.

SFX: Footsteps. Truck doors opening and closing.

PAUL

Check out these custom lights I
just had installed.

SFX: Switch and buzzing.

COOKIE

Oh my. Those are extremely bright.
Very colorful.

PAUL

And they strobe in time with the
music. You like Klezmer?

COOKIE

I'm not sure I--

MUSIC: very loud Klezmer music.

PAUL

I'm not Jewish or anything, but I
somehow connect with it. Go figure
Well, shall we?

SFX: Truck peeling out.

YANNO

Mr. Paul, wait!...I made ceviche.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red!

RED

Well, after that grueling Sulze
session, it's time to calm things
down and visit Krazy Kraft Korner
with Mitchell, from Mitchell's
Krazy Krafts in Hollendale. Hi
Mitchell.

MITCHELL

Good to see you again, Red.

RED

So, what fun craft project are you
showing us today?

MITCHELL

Red, this is the perfect rainy day craft project when your stuck at home with the kids. It's Origami. Or the Japanese Art of Paper Folding.

RED

Fun! So what are you going to show us today, Mitchell?

MITCHELL

Well, first, you start out with a square of paper, any kind will do. But I'm just using paper from the copy machine. I colored it up with some markers.

RED

For our listeners, Mitchell is holding a piece of paper about eight inches square.

MITCHELL

Right. So then, you just fold it in half like this.

SFX: Folding and creasing.

MITCHELL (CONT'D)

And then half again, like this.

SFX: Folding and creasing.

RED

Okay.

MITCHELL

Then you make a half-size diagonal fold, like this.

SFX: Folding and creasing.

MITCHELL (CONT'D)

Then flip it over and do the same on the other side, except two times.

SFX: Folding and creasing.

MITCHELL (CONT'D)

Then, and this can be a little tricky, you pull the top two corner tabs down to the opposite ends below, being careful not to crimp the seams of the outside edge.

SFX: Folding and creasing.

RED

Okay, I think I got it.

MITCHELL

Yeah, that's perfect. So then we fold up the two opposing ends and tuck them into the underside flap that sticks out just ahead of the crease you made on the first fold.

SFX: Folding and creasing.

MITCHELL (CONT'D)

And the last, and most fun part, crimp the ends of the two points you just tucked in, give the whole thing a little twist from the bottom and, voila!

RED

Oh, that's beautiful!

MITCHELL

And it's perfect for Holiday centerpieces.

RED

Well thanks, Mitchell, for showing us another fun and creative craft we can all do at home.

MITCHELL

My pleasure.

RED

And now let's go live, in the field, where Cookie Hightower is visiting a farm with some very unusual livestock. Cookie?

MUSIC: News music.

COOKIE

Red, I'm out here in Pecatonica at the home of Paul Coiler, who has had an interesting run of calf mutations at his farm. Everything from multiple limbs to dual heads. Paul, why don't you show us some of your more interesting calves?

PAUL

Certainly, Cookie.
(calling.)
Come boss...here boss...come boss...

SFX: Calf mooing.

COOKIE

Oh, my goodness.

PAUL

Yeah, that's Sara Lee, she was born last Fall with six legs. You can see three of them jutting out of her side, there.

COOKIE

Oh yes.

PAUL

Come boss...come boss...And that's Daisy Dell, she's got three udders, two in the back and one under her left shoulder.

COOKIE

Oh yes.

PAUL

Come boss...and that's Unlucky Darrel, he's got both sets of equipment under there, as you can see. A set of udders and his own male...uh...sexual appendage.

COOKIE

Oh, my.

PAUL

Gotta be careful when you're milking old Darrel, I tell ya.

COOKIE

I suppose so.

PAUL

Eyes wide open. Careful what you grab.

COOKIE

So Paul, you've had quite a run on these cow mutations; over fifty in just the last couple of breeding seasons. How can you explain this?

PAUL

Not sure, Cookie. I mean, I had the occasion for a few mutations over many years. I had a two headed calf back in 1977. And a multi-limbed bull back in 83. Both of them sold for a pretty penny to the Ripley's Believe It Or Not Museum, up there in Baraboo. But as for these, lately, I guess there must be something in the water or whatever.

COOKIE

And what is your plan for these mutant bovines?

PAUL

Well, I set up a regular contract with the Ripley's people. We're sending these calves to their museums all over the world; Anchorage, Cincinnati, Dubai.

COOKIE

Interesting. I wonder if--

SFX: Calf mooing "Help Me!" Over and over.

COOKIE (CONT'D)

My god...Mr. Coils, is that calf talking? Sounds like he's saying "Help me".

PAUL

(covering.)

Uh, no, that's the way all Gurnsey's sound when they're hungry. Let's get on back to the main house and I'll show you the rest of the operations.

COOKIE

Certainly. This is Cookie Hightower
for WLYR Radio. Now this commercial
message.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red!

Thepholous and Cranberry ad

MUSIC: Lefty & Red.

PAUL

Okay Cookie, so this here's the
main barn.

COOKIE

Looks brand new.

PAUL

Yep, had it put up last year; state
of the art milking and feeding
machines. All automated.

COOKIE

Impressive.

PAUL

The house, of course. Expanded it
to eight thousand square feet,
extra bathrooms, hot tub, tennis
court.

COOKIE

My, your business must be doing
quite well.

PAUL

Can't complain.

COOKIE

And what is that strange looking
green building over there? The one
with the storage tanks and
hydraulic hoses going into it?

PAUL

(covering.)

Oh, that, uh, yeah that's just a
storage shed. Filled with old
garden tools, shovels and rakes and
hoes and what not. Nothing to see
there.

COOKIE

But why does the sign on the door say "Danger: High Radiation. You must be completely chemically sterilized and sealed beyond this point. Absolutely no access to unauthorized personnel"?

PAUL

(after a pause.)

They're really nice gardening tools.

COOKIE

I see. Well thank you for your time, Mr. Coiler. Can anyone stop by and get a look at your mutant calves?

PAUL

Sure, just go to our web site: www.whattheheckisacow.org. You can make an appointment there.

COOKIE

Well thank you, Mr. Coiler. This is Cookie Hightower at the mutant cow farm in Pecatonica, signing off. Well, thank you so much, Mr. Coiler.

PAUL

No problem, my pleasure. You can wait inside if you like.

COOKIE

Oh no, my ride should be here in a few minutes.

PAUL

Suit yourself.

SFX: Walking away.

YANNO

Hello Miss.

COOKIE

(startled.)

What? Oh...Mr. Yanno.

YANNO

Just Yanno. I see you look at the green building.

COOKIE

Yes, very curious.

YANNO

Things happen there. Many things. Many bad things.

COOKIE

What sort of things?

YANNO

Many of them. Many things. Many bad things.

COOKIE

Such as?

YANNO

Many things...that are bad.

COOKIE

Okay.

YANNO

Mr. Coiler, he not what he seems. The things he do in that building. Very bad. Very bad things.

PAUL

(calling.)

Yanno! Where the hell is that good for nothing--

YANNO

(frightened.)

I have to go. Oh, I made you some ceviche.

COOKIE

No thank you.

YANNO

Is good. Raw fish, lime juice, chilli peppers and onions. Very tasty.

COOKIE

No, really.

PAUL

Yanno!

YANNO

I must go. But remember; that building. Bad things. Very bad things.

(calling.)

Coming Mr. Coiler.

SFX: Car pulling up.

COOKIE

(thinking.)

Wait--raw fish and lime juice?

SFX: Car door open.

HERM

Hi, Cookie. How'd it go?

COOKIE

Herm! Get me back to the studio ASAP. I have a feeling a big story is about to break.

HERM

Ooh, I just got chills. Okay, let's hit it.

SFX: Car door closes. Car zooms off on gravel.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red!

RED

And now lets go out to the Cobb Community Center where our own Bob Knefpler is covering regional boys tennis. Bob.

BOB

Thank you Red. And the action is just about set to get underway. This quarter final match pits Clyde's Tommy McDermott against Donnie Brooklander from Montfort. Tommy's set to serve.

SFX: Tennis hit.

BOB (CONT'D)

Ooh, and it's a laser serve.

SFX: Tennis hit.

BOB (CONT'D)
Donnie returns it.

SFX: Tennis hit.

BOB (CONT'D)
Tommy hits it back.

SFX: Tennis hit.

BOB (CONT'D)
Donnie returns.

SFX: Tennis hit.

Okie-doke. I'll put it up on deck
two.

SFX: Tape fast forwarding.

BERT'S VOICE

It was terrible, I tell ya'. Just terrible!

COOKIE

Okay, fast forward a few minutes.

BERT'S VOICE

There were these bright lights. Swirling and flashing. And this weird sound.

COOKIE'S VOICE

What kind of sound?

BERT'S VOICE

Very alien. Very other-worldly. Sounded a bit like the stuff you'd hear at a Jewish wedding. You know, like Fiddler on the Roof?

SFX: Fast forward.

COOKIE'S VOICE

Can you remember anything after the intimate DNA probing.

BERT'S VOICE

No, not really. Although...

COOKIE'S VOICE

Yes?

BERT'S VOICE

I did recall a strange odor at the end. Like the smell of raw fish and lime juice. Terrible. Just terrible, I tell ya'!

SFX: Tape stop.

COOKIE

That must be it. Wayland, I need you to come with me on a mission tonight.

WAYLAND

You mean, like a date?

COOKIE

No, not like a date.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red-Ask Your Neighbor!

RED

Well it's time once again for Lefty and Red's Ask Your Neighbor.

LEFTY

The call-in show where you give advice, post a problem, make an announcement or just swap and barter goods and services with folks in the area.

RED

No money changes hands, no hard feelings.

LEFTY

It's our little, radio version of a neighborhood garage sale.

RED

Without all the stained baby clothes, ugly dinnerware or boxes of bad 1980s VHS movies.

SFX Phone Ring.

RED (CONT'D)

Hi, you're on Ask Your Neighbor With Lefty and Red.

Albert

Hey, this is Albert Klinghoffer, over here in Gillingham.

RED

What can we do for you, Albert?

ALBERT

I just wanted to remind folks that this weekend is the Bass Ackwards Races over at the Richland County Fairgrounds.

LEFTY

Oh my gosh, Bass Ackwards is this weekend already?

RED

For those not familiar, why don't you fill us in on just what Bass Ackwards is?

ALBERT

Well, it's a traditional auto race, except that each car is hitched up to some sort of trailer, and the whole race takes place in reverse.

RED

Everybody going Bass Ackwards.

ALBERT

Yup. We'll have at least fifty cars, all going as fast as they can, in reverse, trying to back their trailers for twenty laps around the track to the finish line.

RED

In the end it's really a demolition derby, isn't it Albert?

ALBERT

Oh no doubt. We got jack-knifin' and fish-tailin' and all sorts of mayhem and destruction. Fun for the whole family. Adults six dollars, children under twelve two dollars. And anyone who brings in a canned good for charity gets in free...no cling peaches, though.

RED

Okay, thanks Albert.

SFX Phone Ring.

RED (CONT'D)

Hi, you're on Ask Your Neighbor.

BERT

Hi, this is Bert Coomes over in Lime Ridge.

RED

Hi, Bert. What's up?

BERT

Well I was listening to your live broadcast about the mutant cows?

RED

Uh-huh?

BERT

And I gotta say, one of them calves sounded a little familiar and kinda scary. Just wondering if anyone else out there listening in noticed it, too.

RED

What was scary about it, Bert?

BERT

Hard to say. Just felt a little creepy to me. If anyone out there heard it, too, call in and Help Me out here.

SFX Phone Ring.

LEFTY

Hello, you're on Ask Your Neighbor.

BERNICE

Hello, this is Bernice Ramsey, over in Muscoda.

LEFTY

Hi-ya Bernice, what can we do for you?

BERNICE

Well I just wanted to let folks know I'm gonna be driving in the Bass Ackwards Races this weekend.

LEFTY

If memory serves you won a couple of years ago, didn't you Bernice?

BERNICE

Yesiree. In 2018 driving an Oldsmobile station wagon towing a Jayhawk camper trailer.

LEFTY

I remember. Like watching a Mad Max episode.

BERNICE

Well this year I'm driving a sponsored car. We're trying to raise money to help with buying blankets and puppy food over at the Woof and Meow Pet Shop.

LEFTY

A great cause.

BERNICE

So I'll be behind the wheel of a 1976 Ford Bronco and towing a float from this year's Muscoda High School homecoming parade. "Sink the Panthers!" We've even got some cheerleaders to volunteer to ride on it during the race.

LEFTY

Are you sure that's safe, Bernice?

BERNICE

Oh sure, they'll be wearing hats and gloves, so...

LEFTY

Okay, so anyone out there want to feed the puppies at the Woof and Meow, give Bernice a call and help sponsor her homecoming death machine.

RED

And that's all the time we have for Ask Your Neighbor. Now this.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red!

SFX: Crickets and night time noise.

WAYLAND

I don't understand. What are we doing here?

COOKIE

Shh! We have to keep this quiet. Hand me the crowbar.

WAYLAND

Here.

SFX: metal prying, then breaking. Door opening.

WAYLAND (CONT'D)

Wait--does that sign say "High Radiation"?

COOKIE

Come on. And keep quiet.

SFX: Footsteps.

COOKIE (CONT'D)

There has to be a light switch--ah,
here we go.

SFX: Switch clicking. Hum of florescent lights.

COOKIE (CONT'D)

Oh my god.

WAYLAND

This is not good.

COOKIE

Look at this, Wayland. Bottles with
unborn, mutated calves floating in
them. Shelves upon shelves, there
must be thousands. Good lord. They
have human feet...and hands.

WAYLAND

Cookie, am I seeing things, or does
this one have a human face?

COOKIE

Oh god, it does. This is bad,
Wayland. Very bad.

SFX: Two blow darts. Fainting and bodies hitting the ground.

PAUL

Nice job, Yanno. You called it
perfectly.

YANNO

Thank you Mr. Paul. I knew if I
dangled the bait in front of this
nosy reporter...we could hook her
and reel her in.

PAUL

Yep. Can't have enough new DNA. You
sure they're out cold?

YANNO

Oh yes, when they wake up later, on
the side of the road, they won't
remember a thing.

PAUL

Good lad.

YANNO
Should I prepare for extraction?

PAUL
Yep. And rustle up some ceviche and
beers, would you?

YANNO
Yes, Mr. Paul.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red!

PAUL
Hi folks, Paul Coiler here inviting
you to come visit Coiler's Carnival
of Animal Oddities out here in
Pecatonica. We are, of course,
famous for our genetically twisted
calves.

BERT CALF
Heelp Meee!

HERM CALF
I reeeeeaaaly want too...

WAYLAND CALF
Bra-Haaa...y`know!

PAUL
But we also have mutated geese.

LOUELLA GOOSE
Honk Bowie in Boaz!

PAUL
Genetically altered chickens.

BERNICE CHICKEN
Ramey..cluck...Muscoda...

PAUL
And sheep abominations.

COOKIE SHEEP
Baaaaa...Hightower!

PAUL

And while you're here, check out our gift shop and snack bar, where you can order a whole range of Filipino delicacies like pancit, longganisa, adobo and ceviche. Right Yanno?

YANNO

You got it Mr. Paul!

PAUL

So come on down to Coiler's Carnival of Animal Oddities in Pecatonica. Or, check out some of our other mutated livestock on display at the Ripley's Believe It Or Not Museum in Baraboo, and other major cities worldwide. Coiler's, we may be more expensive than those other mutant animal sideshows...but we're worth it.

MUSIC: Lefty & Red!

LEFTY

RED

LEFTY

Wayland and Cookie wander by, dazed.

COOKIE

(mumbling.)

I don't...ha...live on air...

WAYLAND

RED

LEFTY

Well, for all of us here at Land Yacht Radio--

RED

Do you want to come with?

LEFTY
